INTRODUCTION

Welcome to Vatican II: Proclaiming the Joy and Hope of Christ to the Modern World!

For nine sessions, we will rediscover the true teaching and vision of Vatican II - and rediscover the New Evangelization for our world today.

Vatican II provides a pastoral vision and renewal that is the foundation for the New Evangelization. The documents of Vatican II reveal a renewal of the mission of the Church to bring Christ to the modern world. The Council shows how every Catholic is called through their Baptism and Confirmation to continue the saving mission of Christ in the world today.

The Council took place from 1962-1965 – but the "event" of Vatican II lasted until the end of Benedict XVI's papacy, who was the last pope to be present at the Council itself. This means that the Church is still unpacking and implementing the Council. This also means that it's important for Catholics to understand what the Council really was. While there have been many "spirits" of the Council that claim authority apart from the actual teachings of the Council documents, it's important to understand the true teaching and vision of the Council.

If you look at any of the previous 20 ecumenical councils, it always takes at least 50-100 years for the dust to settle in the life of the Church after the council. Popes from St. John Paul II to Francis have insisted that there needs to be a rediscovery of the true spirit of the Council by the reading of the documents themselves, as interpreted and implemented in the life of the Church by the Magisterium.

CLASS OUTLINE

I. Dialogue with the Modern World

- *Gaudium et Spes* is oriented towards pastoral renewal *ad extra*.
- The Church reads the signs of the times:
 - External: what's going on in the culture in this time in history.
 - Internal: how the Gospel can penetrate the hearts and minds of modern men and women.
- Pastoral theology is reading the signs of the times in light of doctrine for the sake of dialogue.
- The Church desires to help modern men and women discover the truth about themselves in Christ.

II. Christian Anthropology

- Jesus Christ fully reveals the human person and our dignity and high calling.
- We are made in the image of God who is love.
 We can only come to know ourselves when we give ourselves away in love.
- Through the Incarnation, Jesus unites himself with every person and heals every aspect of what it means to be human.
- Conscience is the seat of human dignity.
- We need to be experts in humanity.
- The apologetics of meaning: Jesus Christ is the answer to all the pressing questions modern men and women are asking.



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What are some of the signs of the times that are present in our culture that we should be aware of in bringing the Gospel to the modern world?
2. In what ways does Jesus fully reveal what it means to be a human person? How can this bring hope to our modern world?
3. What does it mean that Christ has redeemed every aspect of the human person? How does this affect your relationship with Christ when you consider that there is no suffering that he has not experienced?
L. What role does conscience play in our life? Why it is important for the conscience to be well-formed?
5. What is the apologetics of meaning? What are some ways that we can show how Jesus fulfills the deepest longings of the human heart?
