President Janet Zabukovic's Message

Dear Fellow Serrans:

In just a few short weeks, I will begin my fourth and final year of the Denver Catholic Biblical School. I had been thinking about enrolling for several years but always found an excuse not to do that- it was being hosted at a church that was further away than I wanted to drive especially at night, I didn't want to spend the money right then, it was on a day that didn't work in my schedule. But three years ago, my own parish, Divine Redeemer, was chosen to host a new class on Wednesday evenings, and you could even get a senior discount on tuition. Gone was the excuse that the location was inconvenient! Gone was the excuse that it was a time that did not work in my schedule! Gone was the excuse that I didn't want to spend that much money! So I enrolled and my four-year journey studying the bible began. The pandemic's arrival led to online only classes for the second half of year two and all of year three. Now the in-person classes are only being held in the Denver area this coming year and all the rest of the classes will be online again, which I really do not mind at all! Having the multiple online class



options has made it so much easier for many people to begin their own journeys through the Bible, and last year there were students from many states and even students who did not live in the United States. Out of necessity, opportunity arose!

A couple of weeks ago, my books arrived and reminded me that there is a lot of reading and work ahead over this final year. Last week, my student workbook arrived from the school. Of course, I had to leaf through it to see the road map for the journey ahead, which begins with the Psalms and ends with Revelation with lots of biblical reading in between.

Here is what I want to share about my journey. First of all, it is no walk in the park! There is a lot of outside of class reading, weekly homework that takes me several hours to complete, and a

midterm and final test (but both are open book), as well as the commitment to attend the roughly two hour long classes each week. Second, and much more important, is the gift of knowing and understanding- the Mass readings and the homily mean so much more now that I can see the connections between the Old and New Testaments, when I better know and understand the context of the writings and know about the God-inspired authors of the Bible. The Bible has come alive for me, and that is truly a great gift!

I know that several other of our Serrans have already completed or are currently enrolled in the Denver Catholic Biblical School. One of the tenets of being a Serran is to answer our own call to holiness. That is perhaps the greatest gift of undertaking this long and not always easy journey-I know that my own relationship with God has been enriched in innumerable ways. "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ!" insisted St. Jerome. Based on my experience, I would like to encourage all of you to prayerfully consider taking on this four- year transformative journey.

Our August luncheon honoring our Religious Sisters was a joyous occasion! I want to thank all who graciously worked to make this event happen.

Now that our seminarians are back in school, please remember them in your prayers that they have a wonderful year of formation. They are an important part of the future of our Catholic Church and of our Diocese of Colorado Springs!

The Serra International and Serra USA guidance to treasures of small clubs like ours is to keep our total treasury under \$10-\$12K. Since we do not have any major bills outstanding between now and the end of the year, I will seek permission from the Board to move about \$2K to savings.
