In 1990 the Colorado Springs Council for Black Catholics (CSCBC) formed under the direction and endorsement of Bishop Richard C. Hanifen as a council to enhance our identity as Afro-American Catholics doing God's work, and to give one another strength, encouragement, and fellowship.

As such, we have become involved in several activities which allow us to share in accomplishing our mission more actively and to experience the spiritual growth we continually seek.

In 2022 the council implemented its Junior Membership for individuals 13-17 years old.

We are blessed to be a recipient of a grant from the Black and Indian Mission Office to pursue our evangelization and outreach efforts.

February

March

Council members led the Stations of the Cross at one of the parishes.

April

One of the council's members attended the annual Black Catholic Retreat sponsored by the Denver Catholics.

August

Printed material was provided to the diocese for the Bishop's Convocation for Priests. The material included information about the council.

September

Members participated in their Fall session of “Catholic Fire” with college students at the Newman Center. One of the council members provided transportation for some students from nearby Colorado College.

November

The annual St. Martin de Porres dinner, in honor of our patron saint, was held at the Newman Center. We were so blessed that a special Mass was held and that our bishop, Bishop Golka, was the celebrant. The dinner also marks the initial distribution of the Josephite calendars for the following year.



Members attended Mass at Colorado College at the request of the Catholic students' organization. The council provided refreshments for the students in celebration of Black Catholic History Month. The celebrant's Mass intention was in support of the work the council does to promote and educate the community on Black Catholic history.

Three members attended one of the Catholic high school's fundraising gala.

July

Two council members attended the NBCC Conference.
